This week, Marist an-I nounced its new Athletic Director, Kevin Cave, who will start the position on August 1.


Cave graduated from Central Catholic High School in Portland, then went on to Gonzaga University where he played baseball and earned his Bachelor's degree in history with minors in sociology and religious studies.

He furthered his studies at Concordia University and earned his Masters in teaching, and at the University of Oregon, he earned a Juris Doctorate in law, which he practiced for two years.

He has taught history, sociology and government at the high school level. He also has had coaching experience at local high schools.

Most recently, at Thurston, Cave coached cross country, baseball and track. At Central Catholic he coached soccer, cross country and baseball, where he earned the Mt Hood Conference Baseball Coach of the Year award in 2009 and 2011. At Madras, he coached basketball, soccer, and baseball, where he also won the Intermountain Conference Baseball Coach of the Year award in 2007.

Sophomore Arnav Reddy and freshman Alec Vendetti also contributed to the title run with respective scores of 161 and 175.
